Two major grants designed to support our programs were received recently from Westport Rotary and corporate giant AT&T.

Westport Rotary, which funded our holiday music concert last year, generously gave the Friends another \$3,000 which will be used to showcase Chris Coogan once again this December. The Friends are delighted to name Westport Rotary as the ongoing official sponsor of the annual holiday music concert.

The Friends received a grant of \$10,000 from AT&T, who in the past has given several grants to support our activities including building the performance stage. This most recent grant will be used to purchase iPads for our instructional classes. Director Wendy Petty expects this program to be in operation by January 2024 and to be of practical value for seniors at all skill levels.


